Ultrasounds: One Be Lo

He's the emcee you've heard of, but keep forgetting where you heard him from with all the different aliases he goes by. The Pontiac, Michigan native, Nahshid Sulaiman, aka One Be Lo has a new album titled S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M. that drops February. Like his previous effort F.E.T.U.S., it captures a more in depth look at One Be Lo, the artist. With a major distribution deal with Fat Beats Records, via Sony/BMG, his music will finally have the means to increase his already loyal cult-like following across the globe in a more thorough fashion. Like most reasons for acquiring a sonogram for human life it's to check to see the progression. That's what the 22 track release is, a close examination of One Be Lo. So stay tuned, there is much more yet to come, but in the meantime One Be Lo was able to answer some questions about his past, present and future.

Many know you as One Man Army from the group Binary Star, which released what some regard as an underground classic in Masters of the Universe. Now you're One Be Lo, the solo artist. What would you say to the Binary Star fans who know you as that?

I would say that me & Senim no longer work together and haven't for over 4 years due to creative differences. I think that if you was feeling MOTU, then you'll be feeling Sonogram because the same people who are responsible for MOTU are

responsible for S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M.

How long did this album (S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M.) take to make?

27 Years. This project is a combination of everything that I experienced in my life. Childhood, hip-hop, spirituality and family. It all comes together with S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M. That's what I hear on this album, a real life summary, my influences. I'm constantly reminded by the mission I'm on.

What kind of vibe can we expect from S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M.?

I got a few pieces on here that can rock any party, but the main goal was to spit raw lyrics over Trackezoids production. Keep heads bobbin' and bring new ideas to the table. Mostly trying to maintain a balance with the lyrics by sharing personal experiences, telling some stories, and touching on social issues with a few battle verses in there. As far as the beats go, there are some hype ones, some smooth laid back tracks, but they all come together.

What does S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M. mean to you?
S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M. is the official introduction of One Be Lo to the listener. My name, my style, my production team, my views. I feel like a person can listen to this album and walk away with a good idea of who I am. Its something I had to do before I could move on in my career.

What do you mean by before you move on in your

career?

I want people to know who they are listening to. What I'm about, what the mission is, who I roll with, and what to expect or look forward to in the future. Once I get this off my chest I can just make music.

What type of category would you put yourself in as an emcee?

I would say hip-hop. I grew up listening to hip-hop before there was such thing as east coast, west coast or conscious rap. It was all just hip-hop. I consider myself a purist. I'm part of another crew called Massive Monkees. I'm the emcee of the crew, but we got DJ's, Graf writers as well as b-boys. In my opinion, the music industry has corrupted the image of hip-hop, as cliché as it may sound, but that's real. So we're trying to do it right.

What can we expect in the future from you?

I'm on a mission to establish something that's bigger than One Be Lo, the Subterraneous Movement. I see Subterraneous holding it down for years to come. From MOTU to S.O.N.O.G.R.A.M. to whatever we put out, the goal is to make good music, a strong impact on the world of hip-hop. The same way some of our favorite artists had an impact on us.

What is Subterraneous?

Subterraneous is a movement. For now you can find out more about it on our website at [HYPERLINK "http://www.subterraneousrecords.com"](http://www.subterraneousrecords.com) www.subterraneousrecords.com. Its bigger than beats & rhymes or buy my album and T-Shirt. We use hip-hop as a tool to build with the youth and the elementary, middle & high schools as well as colleges and juvenile detention centers. It's a movement led by artists to not only make an

impact in the music world, but in the community as well.

What was it like growing up in Pontiac, MI?

For most of my childhood, my parents were married. During those years I was heavily into sports. Instead of running the streets I was running the basketball court, football field and baseball diamonds. After my parents split up around age 14, I think that was a turning point. I was always a fan of hip-hop but seeing the other kids in the lunchroom sessions spitting rhymes had me thinking I could do something like that, so I started writing. I was okay, my friends would give me props, but sports was my thing. Until one time in high school some emcees that I really respected told me my shit was hot. Back then, you couldn't jump in the cipher unless you earned it, so when I got that approval I knew it was on. From then on, we would go out to Detroit and sneak into the illest hip-hop night that ever existed called the Rhythm Kitchen. We was from Pontiac so we always had something to prove. We would roll like 10 deep, I remember the first time I ever grabbed a mic and rocked on stage. It was so many of us, by the time the mic came around to me the host was kicking us off the stage. So I grabbed the mic and I started spitting anyway. The host got mad and had the DJ drop the beat, but I kept going and going and going and the crowd just went crazy. That was my first experience on stage and that was the night I was born. I was about 15.

Who or what are some of your influences?

There was a time when I would have said KRS-One, A Tribe Called Quest, Ice Cube, etc. etc. but now the Malcolm X's, the Prophet Mohammed, my kids and my experiences. These are the things that impact how I move on a daily basis. Art used to inspire me to be creative, now its life.

What do you do outside of music?

In my world, there is no such thing as spare time. I'm a father, I'm a student of life, I try to live and learn. First & foremost, I'm Muslim. I just recently took a trip to Mecca & Medina and spent a month in Saudi Arabia. It was the greatest experience of my life. I would have to write a whole book like Malcolm X to explain what that was about, but over there it's peace and I want to see that for everybody. That's something we all need.

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Reso Interview

Starting to write in the year 1989 Reso has constantly developed his style and has improved it year by year at an incredible pace. His letters are clear and dynamic. Through out the years he won acceptance in the international graffiti scene and has truly become an important representative of european „classic“ (style-) writing.

Have you been writing the name „reso“ from the beginning on or did you write other names?

I began writing the name „reso“ in 1990. Before that I was using other names and still today, even though I don't speak much about it, I write different names. Other letter combinations can be helpful in the never-ending search for new forms of letters.

You seem to work hard on the creation of new shapes. What's your opinion on characters?

Letters is what writing is about. To me the balance of letters is of great importance. How much written language is an expression of personality can be demonstrated by the way letters bend and are shaped in our handwriting.

Expressing my personality is basically what I do when writing my name with a spraycan. I guess that graffiti artists specialized on characters have a similar approach to it.

So what's your definition of style?

Style is personality. I try to keep my letters clear, logic and dynamic with not too many colors and designs. I don't want to hide my style behind effects and colorings. That would be like hiding my face behind a mask.

What's your opinion on writers doing 3D styles then?

3D can be interesting . But as I said, using too many effects expresses a lack of personality and style. Take just the outline of a piece and you will see the unmasked reality!

You recently published a book called „Straight Lines“ Tell us something about it.

My partner „ecb“ and I had been working on wall productions with a philosophical background. We tried to take individual pieces as the foundation for the development of our joint projects. They have





been the starting point for larger works. The fact that quite often particular elements are taken up again or are reintroduced, made us think about a publication. We did not want to make just another graff-book with as much as pieces as possible.

We had a vision and concept of combining thoughts, texts and photographs.

„ Ultimately, this book only serves as a platform for the things we cherish and which have a story to tell: Souvenirs of our obsession to collect, trophies of our dreams, symbols of our defeats and our aspirations.“

I know that your book was successful at the bookfare in Frankfurt. Is it only available in Europe?

No, it's distributed worldwide. Amazon.com has it for sure.

Are you planing any other project in the near future?

At the moment I concentrate on shirt designs for a company called impact-designz.com. Besides that I'm working on canvases, metal and wood.

Since when have you been working on canvases?

I've been working on canvases for a few years already. At first it was just trying out something else. But over the years I got more and more into it.

It seems that today the attention is going more and more towards street art. What do you think about it?

That's right. There's a big hype of street art at the moment. There has been several publications on street art and even graffiti magazines are showing street art specials. In Europe this hype is due to the fact that there's a changing mentality in the graff-scene. Personally I think that this movement has nothing to do with writing. I'm really wondering what's so special about street art. I just can't really see the message. Apparently it seems to be original to print some stickers and make pretend it's „hardcore“ to stick them somewhere in the street. To me it's just cheap fame. The worst thing I've seen were fotos of homeless people who got painted or who had stickers attached to their cloths and faces. Is this supposed to be funny? I don't know!

There are some writers I know of, who got into that street art thing. What do you mean

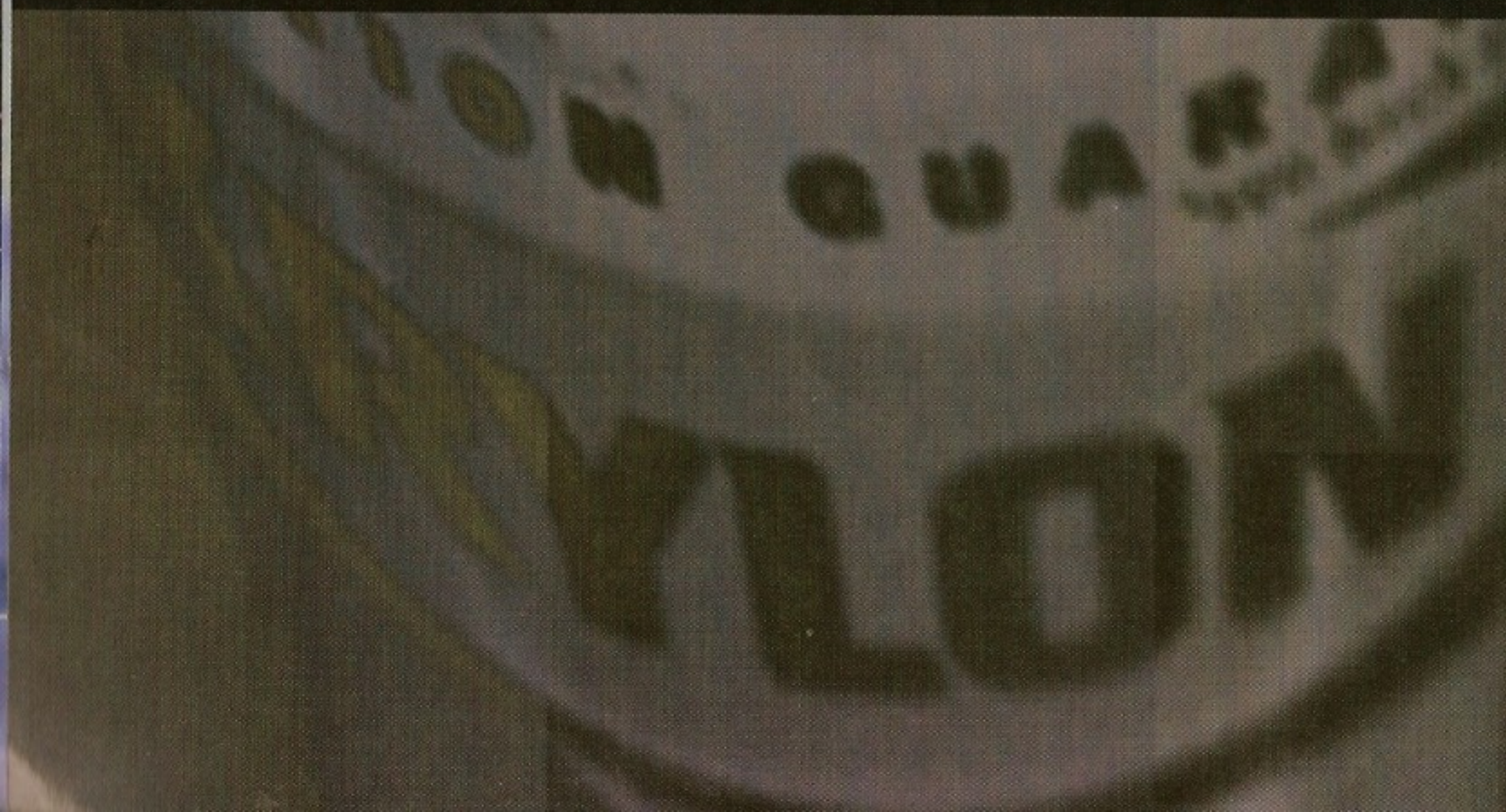


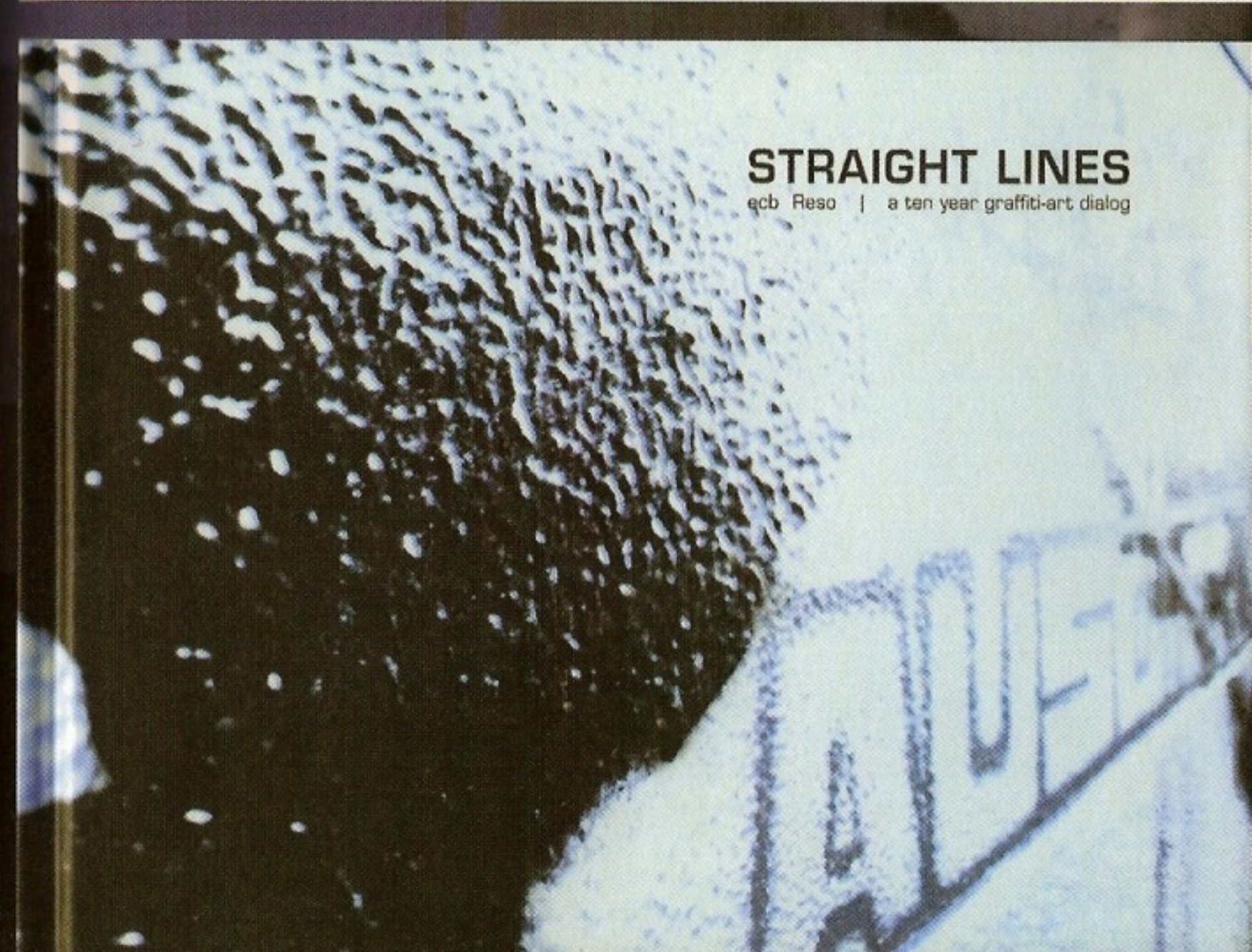
by saying :“ Personally I think that this movement has nothing to do with writing? Isn't it just another form of writing?”

Well, look at it. Street art has much more to do with graphic design than with writing. Writing has to do with letters. As I said before, street art is a cheap way of getting fame. I guess that's why there is a flood of street art at the moment.

As a beer connoisseur for 20 years, a fondness for blondes and an ever-stretching bulge in my lower abdomen as proof, I feel it is my responsibility to share with you what very few "hops hoppers" outside of Europe had the privilege of allowing to trickle past their taste buds. I have sampled countless beers throughout the world and by far my favorite is Bitburger. Drink for flavor! This non-watered down delight is meant to taste, since it is brewed with five different types of hops. Its mild bitterness simply punctuates each sip, swallow and sample. From its savory aroma to its clear yellow colored appearance, it is a taste-bud tantalizing, refreshing drink, which streams with carbonated bubbles forming a nice thick head when poured into a pilsner glass. Unfortunately, the imported version of Bitburger does not do this beer justice, since pasteurization is required to extend its shelf life for sale in the United States. Thus, the Reinheitsgebot (German purity standards for beer) is not followed; therefore, not maintaining all of its tasty qualities. Regardless, the imported version is still well worth the money, averaging about \$8.00 per six-pack.

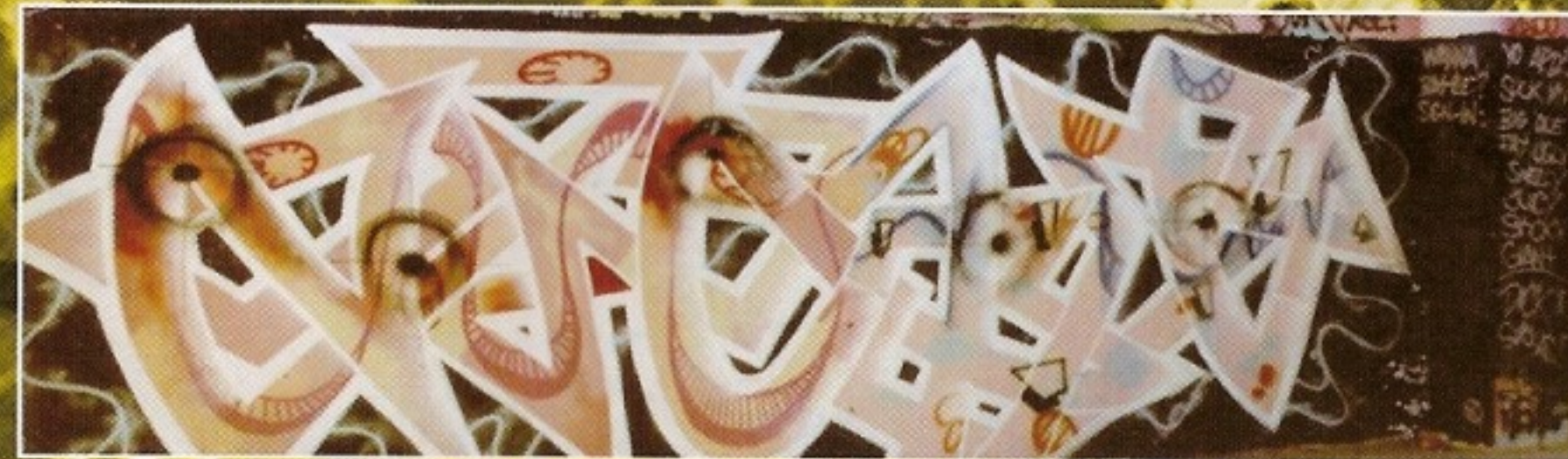
